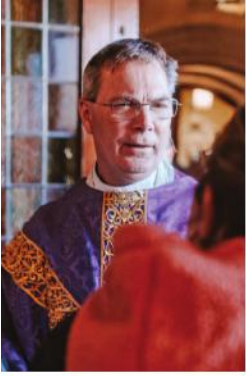

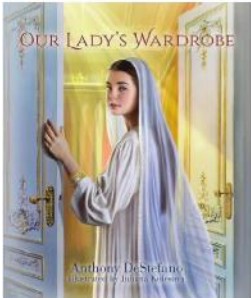

THE CATECHIST'S CORNER

Our Lady's Wardrobe and *Our Lady's Picture Book* by Anthony DeStefano, illustrated by Juliana Kolesova

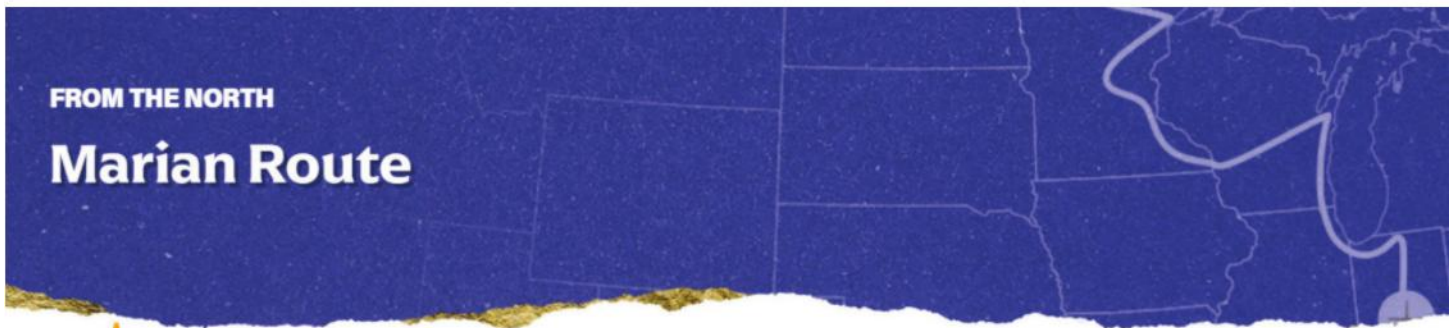
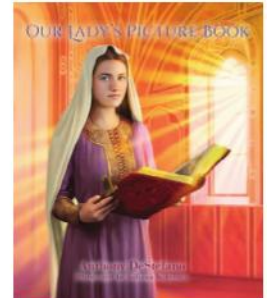


During the month of May as we focus on Mary, we honor her with flowers, songs and prayers. One thing that we might not always consider about Mary is her clothing.

Have you noticed that when Mary is portrayed by her different titles, she is pictured wearing different clothes?

As a child, I found it confusing to understand the different titles we hold for Mary. Was Our Lady of Mount Carmel the same as Our Lady of Guadalupe? What about Our Lady of Fatima and Our Lady of Lourdes? Why so many names for Mary? The book *Our Lady's Wardrobe* begins by asking the reader to imagine Mary as a poor girl in Nazareth with few and simple clothes. The reader is then invited to picture Mary in Heaven with a magnificent wardrobe of apparel. This book does a wonderful job of explaining some of Mary's titles and showing her corresponding garments with stunning illustrations and words.

In the similarly beautiful book titled *Our Lady's Picture Book*, the same author/illustrator team introduces additional titles of Mary as well as events from history and from Mary's life to show her love and care for us as our blessed mother. Most of all, what shines through in the words and illustrations of both of these books is that Mary's beauty, grace and love always lead us to her son. Adults will enjoy sharing these gorgeous books with a child, grandchild, niece or nephew! Just as Mary followed Jesus perfectly throughout his earthly life, pilgrims will journey closely with Our Lord from May 2024 to July 2024.

Please be aware that Verdin Bell will be replacing the A-frames in the bell tower beginning Tuesday, May 28. This will be a three to four day project.

They will be renting an 80' lift that will be on the sidewalk in front of church blocking pedestrian traffic.

Some fun facts about the bell tower: The steeple is unique in that it is the only all stone steeple east of the Mississippi.

The bells were ordered by Fr. TJ Deasey and cast in 1928. They cost \$1,222 at that time. (Equivalent to \$80,000 today)

The four bells are 800lbs, 650lbs, 500lbs, 450lbs with notes of B, C#, D# and E. The bells are rung daily at 9am, noon, 6pm, and 9pm as well as at the end of each wedding and funeral.

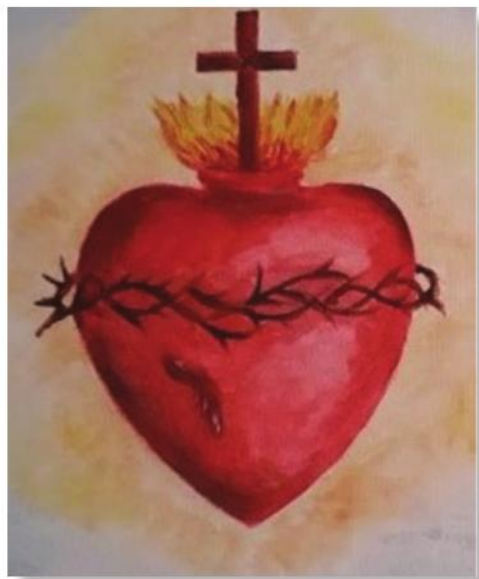
