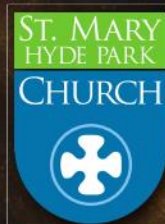

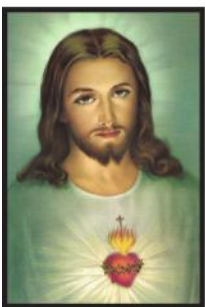

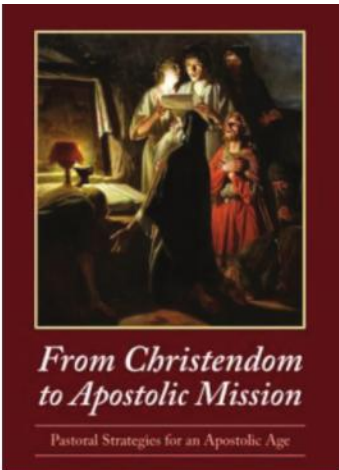

The Catechist's Corner

From Christendom to Apostolic Mission: Pastoral Strategies for an Apostolic Age by James Patrick Shea



Have you ever heard the expression, “we need to gain a biblical world view again?” Recently Pope Francis said to the Roman Curia, “Christendom no longer exists.” In 1974, Archbishop Fulton Sheen declared the same and went on to define Christendom as “the economic, political and social life as inspired by Christian principles.” I think we can all agree our culture and world around us has drifted from these basic tenets. Every human society possesses a moral and spiritual imaginative vision, a set of assumptions and ways of looking at things according to which life proceeds. We are being taught most recently that we can decide for ourselves what is right and wrong, that we can set our own moral code. We might agree that this isn’t working as well as we would like it to. In many ways we have gone back in time when the Apostles were trying to spread the word about Jesus Christ, teaching a new way of thought, a set of fundamental and moral teachings from Jesus. This book helps us to understand how our world around us has changed and how we now are the Apostles who must go out and evangelize, understanding that in so many ways we are starting over and there is

no basic understanding of what Christendom means. The results of Amendment 1 and so many other decisions like it are a clear indication of this. So our jobs have now changed —this book can provide some ideas and guides on how we create our own Apostolic Mission to help our world around us rediscover Christendom, and regain a biblical world view. *(Reviewed by Chris Bergman)*

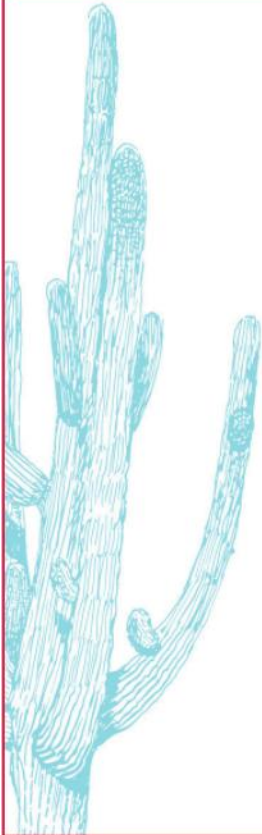

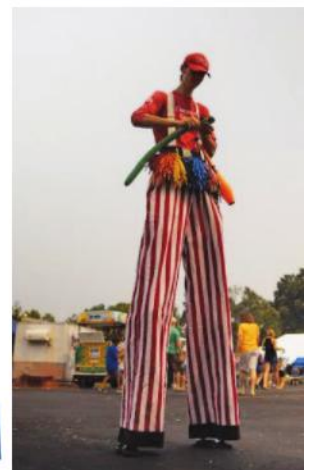

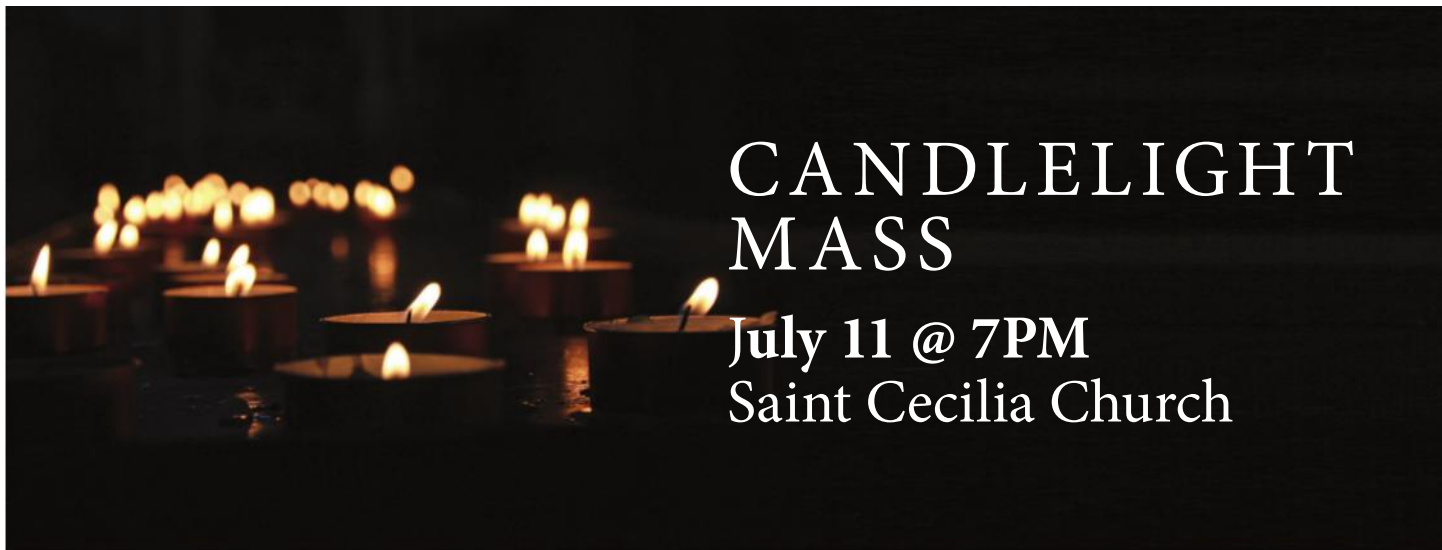
